Introduction

The Virginia Department of Education (VDOE) seeks to provide a high quality, effective learning environment for all students. The Virginia Board of Education has identified this as its first priority within the VDOE's Comprehensive Plan 2018-2023. Ongoing Board priorities include supporting teachers, school, and community leaders in providing effective support to a diverse student body.

As a part of this effort, the VDOE established the Virginia Tiered Systems of Supports (VTSS)

and the VTSS-Research and Implementation Center at Virginia Commonwealth University to support implementation of a multi-tiered system of supports (MTSS). The VTSS, led by the VDOE, collaborates with state universities to provide coaching, technical assistance, and professional learning to school division teams to establish and sustain implementation of their MTSS. The vision of the VTSS is to build sustainable multi-tiered systems of supports through collaboration with divisions, schools, families, communities, and students that results in equitable and improved academic, behavioral, and social emotional outcomes for all.




Through this network of technical assistance, VTSS State Systems Coaches work with school division teams to establish a decision-making framework. This framework provides a system to integrate academic, behavioral, and social-emotional wellness supports. The VTSS approach facilitates the ability of divisions, schools, and communities to provide multiple layers of support to students in an effective clearly defined process.

Report Structure

In this report, implementation efforts are reported for the domains of reach, process, capacity, and outcomes along with VTSS focus areas of early childhood and family engagement which both highlight VTSS implementation efforts.

State Professional Development Grant

Virginia Tiered Systems of Supports: Empowering Educators through a Systems Approach to Implement Evidence-Based Practices

This initiative has resulted in the expansion and enhancement of VTSS along with the integration and alignment of improvement efforts in the Virginia Department of Education (VDOE), including collaboration efforts with Special Education Program Improvement (SEPI) and the Office of School Quality (OSQ). In grant year 5, VTSS continued to assist LEAs with implementation while working toward a return to the basics and solidifying Tier 1 practices. Year 5 highlights include continued alignment of Early Childhood pilot sites.

School Climate Transformation Grant

Enhancing State and Local Capacity to Implement and Sustain VTSS: A Multi-Tiered System of Supports

This project targets building the capacity of the state to offer high quality, evidence-based professional learning and coaching services; increasing opportunities for divisions to improve the fidelity of implementation of a tiered framework inclusive of practices and innovations at advanced tiers and those that specifically address mental health and substance use behaviors; and fortifying the infrastructure of an aligned system by coordinating with Federal, State, and local resources to install and implement visionary solutions to current realities. In grant year 4, VTSS provided 25 training events and 538 technical assistance events. Events focused on strengthening Tier 1 supports in response to continued pandemic impacts. Year 4 highlights include resource development, expanded use and refinement of coaching plans, completion of revisions to advanced tiers training to include family engagement efforts, and expanded use of differentiated coaching supports within the VDOE. Additionally, the VDOE developed a virtual training series that aligns evidence-based substance use prevention, information on substance use identification, and evidence-based prevention methods in a MTSS framework.


Personnel Development Grant

Creating Capacity for Change and Continued Professional Growth: Integrating Comprehensive Retention Planning into the Virginia Tiered Systems of Supports

Through this grant the VDOE will provide targeted training and follow-up coaching for special education teachers; development of a retention plan focused on special education teachers integrated in district leadership team implementation of VTSS; and capacity building at the state education agency level focused on best practices to support school districts in retaining highly qualified special education teachers. In grant year 1, VTSS has partnered with Chesapeake City Public Schools to pilot this initiative and improve special education teacher retention. VTSS is leveraging Canvas as a learning management system to support scale up as the work continues.

Reach

The Virginia Tiered Systems of Supports provides coaching, technical assistance, and professional learning opportunities to nearly 50% of Virginia's school divisions.



Professional Learning Events

In 2021-2022, the Virginia Tiered Systems of Supports staff hosted professional learning events for **1,115** participants.


Process

Training Events

12 training events from June 1, 2021 to May 31, 2022

1,115 total participants across events





98% of participants agreed or strongly agreed that the training events aligned with their division's standards and goals

97% of participants agreed or strongly agreed that the training events emphasized the impact of the content on student outcomes

97% of participants agreed or strongly agreed that the training events improved their knowledge of VTSS

VTSS Open House Pop In Event

An *innovative* event offering several 90-minute sessions to meet the current needs of educators.

131 attendees across the sessions

The event focused on practices most beneficial for managing classrooms. Content included:

- Building positive relationships
- Encouraging a supportive environment
- Engaging students
- Providing effective feedback
- Meeting challenges with curiosity and a few new strategies

Technical Assistance and Coaching

VTSS has a cadre of trained and skilled state Systems Coaches to provide technical assistance (TA) and coaching at the regional and local level.

Of the divisions that responded to a survey:



98% agreed or strongly agreed that the collaborative work between their division leadership team and VTSS is valuable to implementing tiered systems of supports in their division.




88% agreed or strongly agreed that VTSS Systems Coaches have helped their division team develop a framework to implement tiered systems of support with fidelity.



94% agreed or strongly agreed that support from VTSS Systems Coaches resulted in identification of action items that will help build the sustainability of VTSS in their division.

Each year VTSS Systems Coaches write coaching plans for the divisions they support. They select focus areas for coaching supports to improve implementation of multi-tiered systems of supports within divisions.


% of 2022-2023 Coaching Plans by Focus Area







VTSS Division Coaches and Coordinators Summits

VTSS held two *in-person* summits for division coaches and coordinators during Summer 2022.

44 division coaches & coordinators from 18 divisions

Capacity

30 divisions

have **acquired** the capacity to support building-level implementation of VTSS. Of these 30 divisions,

13 divisions

are **fluent** in the capacity to support building-level implementation of VTSS.

84% of divisions have at least one internal coach to support schools in their implementation of VTSS

VTSS State Systems Coaches

VTSS State Systems Coaches serve as a liaison between a division leadership team and the school leadership teams to guide systems intervention and sustainable organizational change.



Outcomes

The Virginia Tiered Systems of Supports utilizes student outcome measures for academics, behavior, and wellness to guide decision making at all levels of practice.



"Over the past two years, our schools have revamped, updated, or completely rebuilt their Tier 1 implementation to meet the needs of students post pandemic. Additional instruction and acknowledgement of prosocial, organizational, behavioral, and academic skills is supporting development of positive school climate. This school year, Amelia County Public Schools has been focusing on using a problem-solving process to make data-informed decisions around behavior and attendance. To support internal coaching, professional learning and coaching have been provided to work with school coaches and leaders on using data to guide decisions so that the process trickles from division to school. 
Preschool is Growing Up with VTSS

Early childhood care and education in Virginia is experiencing a rebirth in a very dynamic way. The primary driver for this rebirth is a vision where all children in Virginia have the opportunity to enter school ready.

The VTSS structure offers the necessary framework to build one cohesive, multi-tiered system of supports spanning from preschool through the early elementary years. The VTSS Early Childhood pilot has been investigating the systems level components and adjustments necessary for implementation and evaluation in schools serving young children. Initially, VTSS enlisted 3 school divisions as partners in this pilot to improve student outcomes. Click on the promotional video to learn more:

Before the pilot, the preschool programs were thought of as separate entities. As a result of participating in the pilot, preschool is no longer a standalone entity and there is more collaboration among vertical teams and between schools:

- Preschool teams join the kindergarten teams during professional learning opportunities.
- Kindergarten teams work with 1st grade teams to develop stronger vocabulary transitions for our students.
- At the beginning of a school year, teachers have a better understanding of where a child is developmentally.
- Schools collaborate when a preschool feeds students into multiple sites.

"I felt like I was in more of a community and I felt like I fit in with elementary better than when I was working alone."

Frederick County also used data informed decision-making to identify professional learning and resources on early literacy. Teachers are now looking at data a little differently and understand that they have the data to change their instructional practice to benefit students.


Family Engagement

Family Partnerships

Family Engagement in VTSS is "...an active, interactive, dynamic, and ongoing process in which family members and key stakeholders engage as equal partners in decision-making, planning, and implementation to support children and adolescents across settings."



25% of School Leadership Teams (SLTs) include a family member(s) and 41% of SLTs have a plan to include a family member.



"We have seen a change in culture and reach in regards to Family Engagement at Caroline County Middle School (CMS) through our VTSS practices. At CMS we want our community and families [engagement] with our students. We are working to invite families in for the fun times, like our 1st quarter color run, but also to help invest in guiding our scholars toward success through mentorship, other reward activities, and transparent information so that our community helps reinforce our efforts. As is said- it takes a whole village to raise a child- and at CMS we welcome the investment to help our Eagles soar."
