## ROLLOUT OF A PRACTICE

Week 1: Provide $\qquad$ on practice \#1. Demonstrate, share a video. Begin implementation.

Week 2: Teachers practice strategies and $\qquad$ They meet in small groups to reflect on practice, successes and challenges, ask for support from peers and/or coach.

Week 3: Teachers $\qquad$ on fluency with the practice (teachers may record themselves) or ask for a peer or coach observation with feedback. They discuss in small group the best places to incorporate the practice in a lesson and rewrite the lesson plans.

Week 4: Meet again as a large group to $\qquad$ and experiences with practice 1. Provide professional learning on practice \#2. Continue...
