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## ROLLOUT OF A PRACTICE



**Week 1:** Provide \_\_\_\_\_ on practice #1. Demonstrate, share a video. Begin implementation.

**Week 2:** Teachers practice strategies and \_\_\_\_\_. They meet in small groups to reflect on practice, successes and challenges, ask for support from peers and/or coach.

**Week 3:** Teachers \_\_\_\_\_ on fluency with the practice (teachers may record themselves) or ask for a peer or coach observation with feedback. They discuss in small group the best places to incorporate the practice in a lesson and rewrite the lesson plans.

**Week 4:** Meet again as a large group to \_\_\_\_\_ and experiences with practice 1. Provide professional learning on practice #2. Continue...
